

### Transcript of study program

You must submit a transcript of study program with your application for Danish authorisation. *All* relevant dental subjects must be stated in your transcript including information of the theoretical and clinical teaching for each subject.

If the theoretical and clinical teaching are stated in *units* or *credits* and not in hours, then your documentation must state what one *unit* or *credit* corresponds to in teaching hours.

The following subjects must *clearly* appear on your transcript:

It is important that the subjects in your transcript are listed with the above-mentioned names. If the subjects in your transcript are *not* listed with the above-mentioned names, you must submit separate documentation for that you have completed these subjects. The documentation must be issued by the student office at your university and contain information of the theoretical and clinical teaching for each subject.

### Curriculum/syllabus

Should you decide to send any complementary documentary evidence such as a curriculum/syllabus in



support of your application, the curriculum/syllabus must clearly show that it has been issued by your university. It must also hold information of your name and your period of study.

The description of the subjects must clearly refer to each subject/topic described in your transcript of study program. This means that the subjects and number of teaching hours (theoretical/clinical) in your curriculum/syllabus must reflect the subjects and number of teaching hours in the transcript of study program. A curriculum/syllabus cannot replace a personal transcript of study program.

You must refer to the relevant pages of the document where the information of the subjects can be found. In the event that it is *not clearly* stated where we can find the necessary information or should there be a discrepancy between the information in the document and the information in your transcript, **then the curriculum/syllabus will not be part of our assessment.**
